We look forward to being involved again next year! Have a look at the promotional video in the link below and look out for the cheeky cameo at the end!








# The benefits of being present

#### **HOME ECONOMICS**

Hospitality: With the 2021 year 12 group completing the requirements of the Certificate II in Kitchen Operations our focus has shifted to the HSC class of 2022. Students from several classes were involved in the catering required for our school showcase of major works. This involved making and then serving a range of gourmet products to guests. Our dual qualification students in Hospitality Specialisation are also looking at different serving styles and created a pasta bar to test their skills. All classes are rapidly making up time in the kitchen which was lost to lockdown so that they are up to date for next year.

Food Technology: Our food technologists have almost completed their first HSC module: The Australian Food Industry. Students examine Australian food producing companies and discover the industry's value to our society and economy. They research Australian companies both large and small and investigate the products that they create.

**Textiles and Design** students are commencing their major works. They are discovering the process of design and applying the skills that they acquired in yrl1 to their final product. The design folio is a major component of the work and is an area which students are working on to assist in the planning of the project. Many of 2021 major works were displayed at the school showcase evening, serving as inspiration to the new year 12 students of 2022.

**Exploring Early Childhood** have been creating nutritional foods for young children. Recognising the value in healthy diets for children and how important it is for growing bodies. Students designed healthy options for party food as well as looked at different nutritional benefits of specific foods for infants and expecting mothers.

#### **ABORIGINAL EDUCATION**

Callaghan College Jesmond Senior Campus is proudly committed to supporting Aboriginal students by providing cultural opportunities, academic support, career and transition planning, and this year has seen some exceptional opportunities and outcomes for our students.

News of our Aboriginal students' academic success in terms of HSC completion, university entry and gaining a Ma Morley scholarship for a third year in a row has led to interviews with NITV and Cairns Indigenous radio.

Our cultural programs led by Alex Nean and Haylee Mills enabled our dancers and Yidaki players to perform at the NRL Indigenous round, Anzac Day and numerous school assemblies.

Students from our Junior Aboriginal Consultative Group delivered Acknowledgement of Country and were involved as leaders in the development of our College Acknowledgment video. Our President, Lilly Davies received The Aboriginal Student Leadership Award at the AECG's Make a Difference Awards.

Students also have made successful transitions to trade apprenticeship and received support from the NRLs School to Work program. Students have had meetings with our careers team to ensure their pattern of study matches their aspirations and that they received current information regarding future career pathways.

Bridgette Hey and Tammie Neal provided academic tutoring to support students with assessment tasks and examination preparation.

#### **CAREERS/VET**

Our Year 12 HSC students took advantage of individual career interviews to assist in their planning for a transition to further study and/or work. Students were assisted in applying for University and TAFE courses with many receiving early offers through the School Recommendation Scheme. Students were given assistance in finding and applying for scholarships, alternative entry schemes and enabling programs.

Some of our students have also commenced a trade career through gaining an apprenticeship or traineeship at the completion of their school delivered Certificate credential, a School Based Traineeship or through our Apprenticeship Incubator Program. Students took advantage of virtual careers expos, interviews through zoom and interactive websites to help develop their Career and plan.

Students were supported through our network of organisations including Careerlinks and The Newcastle Council's Youth Industry Partnership, JobQuest's Transition to Success and The NRL's School to Work Program.

2022 Year 12 students have had many interviews to assist them refine their pattern of study for their HSC year. A Careers Newsletter has been emailed to students on a weekly basis to ensure they kept up to date on employment, study and scholarship opportunities.

Our team prides itself on meeting the needs of all students and aims to assist in the development of careers goals and pathways.

#### **MATHS**

All students have recently completed their first HSC Assessment Task. It is essential that students gain the maximum from this experience.

The Assessment Task should give you an overall feel for how well you are progressing in your course. Be honest with yourself. If your results were not as you expected, then now is a good time to find the cause.

Even though the next task may seem a good way off, now is the time to plan your strategy. Feedback from the task will disclose the concepts with which you are having difficulties. These topics should form the core of any review you undertake. When revising do not fall into the trap of concentrating on topics you already know well and ignoring those you find hard.

Many HSC students have purchased the Past Papers booklets. Theses are an excellent source of study and practice material. The 2022 booklets will be made available for purchase in early Term 1.

Students are encouraged to begin the process of producing chapter summaries for all topics studied in Year 11. All levels of Mathematics will examine some of the Year 11 course in the HSC Exams and students must be prepared for this - our most recent HSC Exams have again reminded us of this paradox.

To participate fully in class activities students need to come to class equipped with appropriate materials, including a calculator (\$20, Maths Staffroom).










