
We look forward to continuing to partner with our families throughout the year ahead.

INTERNATIONAL LEARNING

Europe here we come!

We will soon say Bon Voyage to our group of Year 12 HSIE students embarking on their Europe History Tour.

Our travellers will enhance their studies in modern and ancient history, visiting numerous historical sites throughout Europe.

Commencing in Italy, students will see first-hand the archaeological sites of Pompeii and Herculaneum, witnessing a working archaeological dig and expanding their ancient history knowledge and understanding.



Moving into Germany and Austria, students will then visit Munich, Dachau and Nuremberg. These places are central to the new Modern History syllabus and understanding our world in the 21st Century. Students will explore and develop their understanding around power and authority in the modern world during 1919 to 1946.

France and Belgium are the next stops, with a particular focus on the Battlefields of the Western Front. Students will visit key Australian battlefields including Fromelles, Pozieres and Passchendaele, where they will lay wreaths, as well as attend the Last Post Ceremony at the Menin Gate in Ypres and the ANZAC Day Dawn Service at Passchendaele. Visiting these locations gives students an opportunity to view evidence for themselves in situ and in museums, enhancing their learning of core modern history.

The final part of the tour will take students to the City of Lights - Paris. Here, students will gain a brief overview of the city and its history, expanding their understanding and appreciation of revolutionary France, the world at the beginning of the 20th Century and the opportunity to recognise the role of this city in the development of social, cultural and political trends and ideologies that have had such a dramatic effect on the world today.

Our Principal, Mr Macey, will guide our travellers through their journey, supported by three additional Callaghan Jesmond staff. The tour is shared by students from Tuggerah Lakes Secondary College, providing further opportunities for students to explore ideas and perspectives from others.

We wish our students a safe, wonderful, exciting and fulfilling journey and we look forward to hearing your stories and findings on your return.

MULTICULTURAL EDUCATION

Support for English an Additional Language / Dialect students

Jesmond and surrounds have supported new migrant arrivals for many years, enriching and broadening the benefits of the area. At Callaghan Jesmond, we have one of the most culturally diverse student populations in region.

Our school welcomes students, families and community members from all cultural backgrounds and we appreciate the valuable diversity that these cultures bring. Our aim at Jesmond Campus is to create a safe and inclusive environment that benefits all students in their senior studies journey.

Callaghan College embrace teaching and learning programs that develop intercultural understanding, promote positive relationships and enable all students to participate as active Australian and global citizens.

Students that have English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) are supported by our EAL/D specialist team. The experienced, passionate and bilingual EALD specialist team support students and their teachers throughout class and in one-to-one tuition. Extracurricular English literacy sessions are also facilitated weekly. This specialist support enables each student to better meet their learning goals and succeed in their study.

The compulsory HSC English Curriculum also provides specific English EAL/D Courses that cater to students with various levels of English language ability and needs. The English courses at Callaghan Jesmond range from beginner level to advanced level, helping to build overall academic language skills for success in the high school curriculum.

At Callaghan College Jesmond, the shared goal of learning binds our students with purpose and enables individuals to flourish in a supportive, progressive and empowering senior high school educational environment.



PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

Incredible career pathways

SPORT REPORT


Sporting success

NSWEduChat

Using technology for good

This term Callaghan Jesmond has been presented with an exciting opportunity that has the potential to shape the way students and teachers use technology in learning.

Across our campuses, Callaghan College has for many years had a keen focus on using technology and software in innovative ways to improve the way we teach, learn and communicate. As an example, we were one of the first schools to introduce online learning practices as part of everyday learning, well before COVID lockdowns.


This focus and acceptance of technology and innovation now brings us to an exciting new development in learning at Callaghan.

Many of us would be aware of a range of emerging technologies referred to as artificial intelligence (AI). One kind of AI is generative AI (GenAI). Some examples of GenAI you may have heard of or used include ChatGPT, Bing and Bard.

As this technology develops and how it can assist in learning are explored, the NSW Department of Education has developed NSWEduChat, a customised GenAI app. Unlike ChatGPT, NSWEduChat is suitable for students, is within the Department's firewall and has been created with safeguards that other GenAI apps do not have.

At Callaghan Jesmond, we are committed to providing evidence-based, quality learning opportunities for our students. We are one of only 16 schools to be selected to first explore how NSWEduChat can be used effectively in classrooms.

But what does this technology mean for teachers and students and their learning?



NSWEduChat will provide a safe and secure environment for teachers and students (Stages 3–6) to use GenAI in teaching and learning.

Students can use the app to help develop their writing skills, or to help them generate a scaffold for essay writing. They can use the platform to assist them in studying for a test or exam, or for creating a tailored study schedule around their work and school commitments.

Students can also use it to implement teacher feedback, to check their understanding of specific key terms and to assist in clarifying any content questions they may have in relation to topics they may be studying.

One of the exciting features of the platform is its ability to translate English into many different languages, which is of great assistance to our students who are studying with English as a second language.

NSWEduChat can be accessed through each student's online portal and uses conversational style questioning to guide students in their learning journeys.

This is a fantastic opportunity for our students to participate in this trial during Term 1 and Term 2. Students will be able to provide feedback on the app as they explore and use the technology, helping shape the app's future structure, capabilities and use.

At all times the current school rules, policies and procedures will apply for everyone involved. Parents/carers will be sent a data privacy notice to read. If a parent/carer decides to have their child opt out of the NSWEduChat trial, this can be communicated to the school.

We are looking forward to seeing how NSWEduChat can enrich teaching and learning at Callaghan College Jesmond Senior Campus and help our students achieve their learning goals.




SENTRAL PARENT PORTAL

Accessing timetables, attendance information and school reports

The Sentral Parent Portal is a secure online platform that provides parents and carers with access to their child's timetable, attendance information, school reports and daily messages from teachers to students. The platform is also used to book times for Parent Teacher evenings.

For families that are not already connected to the Sentral Parent Portal, gain access by following the below steps -

1. Go to the Callaghan College Jesmond Campus [website](#).
2. Scroll down on the homepage and click on the blue Sentral Parent Portal link under '[Parent Access](#)'.
3. Enter the preferred contact email address you provided the school as your username.
4. If you don't already have a password, click forgot password and reenter your email address. You will be sent an email to reset or create your new Sentral Parent Portal password.
5. Return to Student/Parent Portal [login](#) and enter your new Sentral Parent Portal password.
6. Once in the portal you will need to enter a family key. This also links you to your child/ren in our online learning platform Canvas. Family keys have been issued via email.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Every day counts

A day away from school here or there doesn't seem like much however, absences do add up.

Missing as little as 1 day per fortnight can equate to missing 4 weeks of school per year. Turning up late or skipping classes also means you'll miss out on important learning opportunities.

What you learn in each class, on each day, builds on what you learnt the class before. Make school attendance a priority, along with getting to school on time.

If students arrive after the 8.24am bell, they are to go straight to the Admin Office to sign in. A late note will be issued and students are to take this with them to class.

If students need to leave early for an appointment, a note is required from parents stating the reason and the date and time for early dismissal. Parents can also phone the school to confirm details. Students will be issued with an early leavers pass once details are received and confirmed.

If a student misses school due to illness, family circumstances or religious reasons, parents/carers are required to explain the absence.

MOBILE FREE

Keeping phones off and away

Mobile free learning areas were implemented by Callaghan Jesmond to support the NSW Government's ban on mobile phones in NSW high schools.

At our campus, all students are to have their own mobile pouch. This pouch remains the property of the school however, students are responsible for its care.

Pouches should be locked for the duration of the school day, except for making canteen payments or directed by teachers for class or library use.

By removing the distraction of mobile phones, a supportive environment is created for students to immerse themselves more fully in learning and be more present in their interactions with teachers and peers.
