

CAREERS TEAM UPDATE

During Term 3 Year 11 and 12 students have taken advantage of opportunities to explore and plan their future careers. Thanks to our School Based Trainee Mali Frazer for her assistance in producing a weekly Careers Newsletter promoting opportunities for training and employment.

Year 12 students have taken up the offer of individual career interview during terms 2 and 3 to assist with their transition to further study and/or work post school.

A successful Head Start Program finished up on Friday 1 September at the Business Growth Centre, Gateshead. Two Jesmond Campus students successfully completed the FEMALE Pre Apprenticeship program with HunterNet Career Connections and Central Coast Community College in Electrical, Mechanical and Machining. Our students, Zali Kilgour and Jaylee Olsen (pictured to the right) met with 2 female apprentices who provided an insight into the workforce. It is great to see students having the opportunity to connect with such great role models working in non-traditional trades.

Our Start Up Program students attended a Barista training day at the Australian Barista School to enhance the skills they have acquired in running our coffee van.

Regional Industry Education Partnerships (RIEP) have developed a girls only introduction to trades program called Girls Can Too! including hands on activities in a variety of trades, work experience and mock interviews with employers. 5 of our students have been successful in this sought after initiative commencing in Term 3.

Our partnership with the Educational Pathways Program has resulted in students taking up taster course at Tafe in Performance, Nursing, Beauty Therapy and Screen and Media.

The University of Newcastle is piloting access to their Open Foundation enabling program with our school. 6 students have commenced Open Foundation whilst continuing with their HSC studies.

Students have recently received offers through Newcastle University's new Early Entry Scheme and are awaiting the outcome of applications through University Admission Centre.

Science

The Year 11 journey is also almost over as they prepare now for final examinations and look forward to beginning their Year 12 course in Term 4.

The Biology students have finished their Year II experience with a trip to the local wetlands as part of their second assessment task. The weather in the lead up to this excursion was a worry, however the day itself turned out to be fantastic and sunny. Students spoke fondly of their adventures on the day.

The Science faculty would like to congratulate all Year 11 students on the hard work and motivation shown through the preliminary courses. We are excited to see this continue into Year 12 and the 2024 HSC.

English
