It helps music creators get paid for their work, and provide a straightforward way to legally play and copy music. Royalties keep the music coming and ensuring the industry's future.

SongMakers is a trail-blazing, contemporary music initiative nurturing students' creativity and team skills. Australia's leading songwriters and producers collaborate with students to create and record new music on school campus.

Students are immersed in a real world, collaborative co-writing environment and given invaluable insight into the forces that drive the global contemporary music industry.

Engaging, challenging and rewarding, SongMakers fast tracks young people's understanding of opportunities in today's music world. It helps unlock a range of creative capabilities important for success within and beyond the music industry. It's about creating songs and helping get more next-gen hitmakers onto the world's playlists.

SUPPORTING TEACHER WELLBEING

A call to respect work-life balance

As part of our school's partnership with families, we want to bring you up-to-date with a recent initiative by Department of Education to establish clearer boundaries for teachers' right to 'switch off' from non-emergency communication outside of school operating hours. This new Department procedure is being introduced to support our communities in enjoying a healthy work-life balance.

While digital communications have made it easier than ever to stay connected, they can also lead to an increasing expectation of nearinstant responses, which can sometimes blur the boundaries between work and personal time for staff.

We understand that as parents and carers, you may have questions, concerns, or valuable information to share with teachers at various times throughout the school year. We value your involvement in your child's education and encourage open communication. However, we also ask for your support in respecting the wellbeing of our teachers in the following ways:

• Be considerate of our teachers' personal lives and their right to 'switch off' by limiting non-urgent communications with teachers to during school hours wherever possible.

• Have a respectful expectation around the timeliness of teacher responses for non-urgent matters. At Callaghan College, we aim to respond to non-emergency communications within 2 to 3 days during school operating hours.

We respect our families reasonable response times too!




It takes time to plan, organise, book and pay for school excursions, special events and camps. We appreciate our families responding to the deadlines for permissions, payment and providing additional information where needed.
